

Answer our 10 big questions



1. What do you think about our vision for North East Cambridge?

Comment Vision seems to include blighting another area by relocating the Waste Water Treatment Plant to the Green Belt. I believe the Plan should be reconsidered in the light of the 2020 Pandemic (housing more people in central Cambridge and reviving businesses there?).

2. Are we creating the right walking and cycling connections to the surrounding areas?

Comment It is good to improve walking and cycling connections but if the WWTP is moved to Honey Hill it will not be easy or pleasant to walk, cycle, or ride a horse on existing rights of way in that area.

3. Are the new 'centres' in the right place and do they include the right mix of activity?

Comment All areas of Cambridge should have access to food outlets, community facilities etc but this Plan should support those already existing in central Cambridge and neighbouring areas more.

4. Do we have the right balance between new jobs and new homes?

Comment More homes are needed somewhere and there is a case for expansion of the Science Park, however I do not support a large development in this area or the creation of jobs to attract more people in the South East.

5. Are we are planning for the right community facilities?

Comment Right facilities - health, library, community - for anywhere with a lot of people. See comments at 3. and 4. (I believe the people should be accommodated elsewhere.)

6. Do you think that our approach to distributing building heights and densities is appropriate for the location?

Comment 5 storeys high enough. Too many people crammed in to the area is likely to lead to social problems.



7. Are we planning for the right mix of public open spaces?

Comment Better to support and enhance the Green Belt (Imaginative green ideas are no substitute for gardens.)

8. Are we doing enough to improve biodiversity in and around North East Cambridge?

Comment Construction of all these buildings and the (possible) relocation of the WWTP to the Green Belt will be detrimental to biodiversity.

9. Are we doing enough to discourage car travel into this area?

Comment Doing too much to discourage car travel - not everyone can walk^{far} or cycle. Vehicle access is necessary for medical services, plumbing problems, deliveries etc. Inadequate parking is bad for climate change.

10. Are we maximising the role that development at North East Cambridge has to play in responding to the climate crisis?
